Insurance

Only Having Insurance "Through Work" Doesn't Work

Do you know anyone whose life or career has drastically changed during these years of economic downturn? 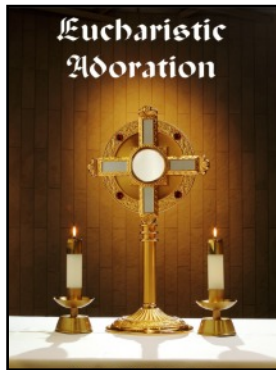

-- Bits and Pieces --

Covid jabs linked to abortion – Nothing particularly new here, just more confirmation that these companies knew exactly what they were doing even though they tried to hide it! Pfizer, Moderna and J & J all used aborted fetal cells during their vaccines testing phase., J & J also used the cells during the design and development and production phases. A Pfizer executive, Vanessa Gelman, in a leaked email stated, “that they had been trying as much as possible to not mention the fetal cell lines.” When a reporter for Project Veritas approach Gelman in a residential area regarding the email, she actually ran down the sidewalk and escaped into a house. Abortion pills over the counter – 22 AG's sent a letter to the FDA demanding an end to the “over the counter” sales stating that it was dangerous and illegal. The AG's stipulated that the FDA's new rules do not negate pre existing state laws regulating the administration of abortifacient drugs. Florida's governor, Ron DeSantis, has stated that Walgreen and CVS would not be able to sell abortion drugs in Florida as it would violate pre existing state laws.

Mailbox Pharmacy – The Biden administration says that the 150 old Comstock Act does not mean what it plainly states. That is, that it is illegal to deliver through the mail X number of articles including drugs. Yet he intends to push this through.

March for Life 2023 - The attendance at this year's march is being hailed as similar to those of previous years. This means that 10's of thousands marched. The event has not lost any of it's enthusiasm and vigor as the challenges to LIFE remain very great. An estimate of the number of marchers has not been calculated as of this writing.

Pro abortion violence – 122 Catholic churches have been damaged to one extent or another since the leaked Dobbs memo with not one arrest to date. Nor can the person who caused the leak be identified even with the much publicized investigation by the officials at the Supreme Court.
