I wish all of you a Blessed and Happy New Year. Stay safe and well.

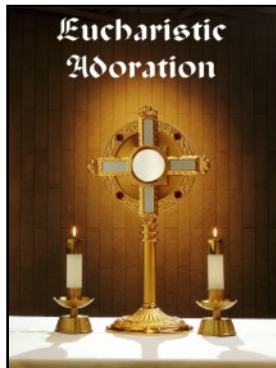

Pro Life News

A coalition of pro-life organizations called on the US Department of Justice to address the “ongoing violent attacks against pro-life organizations”. This group is led by Mike Pence and his Advancing American Freedom Initiative. The inquiry seeks to determine whether the DOJ is intentionally ignoring the attacks on pro-life groups. Pregnancy centers, pro-life organizations, private individuals and churches across the U.S. have been targeted by abortion extremists with violence, vandalism, and harassment since the May 2 leak of the draft majority Supreme Court opinion in the Dobbs case. (Notice that no one was ever identified as causing this leak.) The demand for DOJ action and pertinent records occurred earlier this past fall, and pro-life Americans continue to wait for the Federal government to address pro-abortion attacks. According to Catholic Vote, at least 100 Catholic churches and 78 pregnancy centers and other pro-life organizations and churches have been attacked since May, without a single DOJ charge in connection with these attacks. Meanwhile the DOJ's Civil Rights Division has alleged FACE ACTS violations against 26 pro-lifers who have been charged this year. As of Dec 6, Associate Attorney General Vanita Gupta, while criticizing the overturn of Roe v. Wade, admitted the DOJ was targeting pro-lifers in response to the overturn of Roe saying that this situation increased the “urgency” of the DOJ's work—including the “enforcement of the FACE ACT, to ensure continued lawful access to reproductive services. (Let us pray that the FOIA (Freedom of Information Act) will eventually bring light and progress to this grossly unjust situation. At the same time we must remember that Jesus said that if they persecute me, they will do the same to you.)

The Thomas More Society attorneys have secured a settlement of the lawsuit filed against David Daleiden by the Univ. of Washington over Daleiden's public records requests for documents related to UW's national clearinghouse for the fetal tissues and organs of aborted babies. The Ninth circuit Court of Appeals approved a settlement of this case which has been a six-year battle. In the settlement, Daleiden secured an agreement to obtain significant additional public documents (thousands of pages) related to the UW's purchase, processing, and sale of the organs and tissue from aborted human fetuses. Also secured was a \$30,000 payment for attorney's fees. While this is a win for the Thomas More Society and David Daleiden, he is still being persecuted in California in a case originated by the now VP of the United States.
