## Insurance

Easter greetings! As we roll through the first full month of spring we celebrate Easter with thoughts of gratitude for the gift of new life. The Resurrection and thoughts of our Savior's sacrifice and triumph over death are fresh in our minds and hearts. The dreariness of winter and Lent fade away with April rains that seem to have their own scent. All nature seems in bloom. Trees barren not long ago are now budding and flowers begin to poke through the warming soil. For many, it's their favorite season of the year. Along with everything else going on in April, it is also Autism Awareness month. The Autism Speaks website ([www.autismspeaks.org](http://www.autismspeaks.org)) contains much more information that I can give you here. Autism has been more widely discussed and better understood in recent years. Although the TV show "The Good Doctor" portrays a doctor who has autism, those with Autism Spectrum Disorder exhibit a broad range of characteristics. Many have much less functionality than the doctor portrayed on the show. I mention this because many of us know of someone who is on this autism spectrum. If diagnosed early in childhood and intervention begun, those with autism may still live a relatively normal life. However, many with autism struggle and have other complicating medical or psychological issues and need much support during their lives. That's where the Knights of Columbus Family Fraternal Benefits may be able to help. The Family Fraternal Benefits cover a number of situations. One benefit addresses the child who is older than 60 days and younger than 18 and is uninsurable according to our ordinary underwriting practices. Many children with autism as a primary or secondary diagnosis fall into this category...uninsurable. For those children, the Order has a special family fraternal benefit that allows the issuing of an ordinary permanent life insurance policy on this uninsurable

child. Some members may be unaware of this benefit, but it's great news for any parent with a child who does not qualify for life insurance. There are some other qualifiers for the parents and any other children in the family, including that the father must be a member in good standing in his council. I won't go into the others here, but this is a very worthwhile benefit, not only for those children with autism, but for any child who may be uninsurable. If you know of a Catholic family that may have a child with autism or any family with a child who is uninsurable, please reach out to me. They may be unaware of this benefit. I will be happy to contact them explain this valuable protection that is available. If you prefer, give my name and contact information to that parent so they can contact me at their convenience. As always, there is never any requirement to purchase any product, but a consultation about this benefit may bring them some small comfort. As always, thank you for the opportunity to serve you, my members. Enjoy your spring!

## 2023 Tootsie Roll Drive Knights Bulletin

Save the Dates! **April 28 th and 29th** the Knights of Columbus annual community Tootsie Roll Drive will be held. The key to success centers on People Power! The Lord provides eve rything needed to aid those with intellectual disabilities served by Cardinal Services, Special Olympics, and Magical Meadows except for your YES to volunteer and help.

In 2022, 67 volunteers shared their time and talent to work 323 man hours on Tootsie Roll weekend. 37 of those volunteers were from Knights of Columbus and Sacred



Heart Parish members. 10,800 Tootsie rolls were distributed and \$19,728 was raised.

The Knights Tootsie Roll project has been going strong for 47 years. Warsaw's Tootsie Roll records go back to 1986; since that time the Warsaw council has raised \$580,855. We need your help to keep this tradition going.

The Lord will again place the cars and shoppers on the streets and at the stores on April 28 th and 29th. 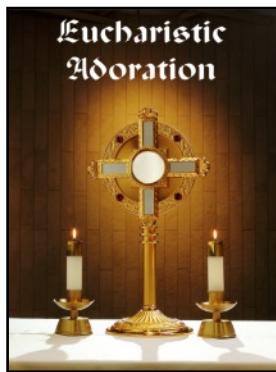

## Pro Life News

PRO LIFE – Bishop Rhodes produced a long and thorough response confronting Notre Dame’s Gender Studies program and the John J. Rielly center after hosting a program that gave an invited activist speaker a platform to advance abortion without questions or debate. The speaker, Ash Williams, has been vigorously fighting to expand abortion access by funding abortion and by training others to do the same. Bishop Rhodes’s well presented response states that this is a grave mistake in judgement and that it creates scandal.

-UTAH has banned all abortion facilities in the state by requiring abortionists to meet the same quality standards as hospitals. The bill forbids out-of-state abortionists from dispensing abortion pills to citizens of Utah.

-The Defense Department has recently issued newly revamped and expansive abortion rules. As a result Sen Tommy Tuberville, R-AL, is blocking all DOD nominees until the Pentagon rescinds its policies promoting abortion. He states that he is receiving a lot pressure to stop but that he is steadfast in his resolve to hold his ground. Sen Tuberville’s actions will put in limbo 200 potential promotions of senior officers. He calls the Pentagon’s pledge to fly any personnel and/or family member to a place of abortion an “abortion travel agency.”

- On March 15, a Texas judge heard arguments in a case questioning the legality of the Food and Drug Administration year 2000 approval of the chemical abortion pill, mifepristone. The approval process of this pill by the FDA is highly questionable. Let us pray that the outcome of this case will be in the name of “life”.

-Indiana abortion numbers are down nearly 50% since the Dobb’s case.

- Another mother surrendered her baby through the “Safe Haven Baby Boxes.” This happened in Syracuse In. A front page article regarding this happening was in the Times Union newspaper on March 18/19. This makes the 3rd baby saved in the NCIRTL area thus far this year via these “boxes.”

-WYOMING has passed into law a bill that will bring an end to the distribution of chemical abortion pills in that state. This is the type of bill that explicitly and fully protects pre born babies and their mothers from the disastrous effects of chemical abortion.

-The Family Research Council states that experts have documented at least 420 incidents of hostility and/or violence against houses of worship and pro life pregnancy resource centers in the U. S. over the past years. 137 such attacks had occurred in the 1st 9 months 2022. Yet none of these have been investigated by the DOJ.

- The infamous Southwestern Women’s Surgery Center in Dallas which had been killing babies for over 5 decades has closed. This facility was owned by an infamous abortionist, Curtis Boyd. Boyd was killing babies even before Roe V Wade and by his own words, he knew exactly what he was doing. Let us pray that he begs God’s forgiveness before he passes from this world.

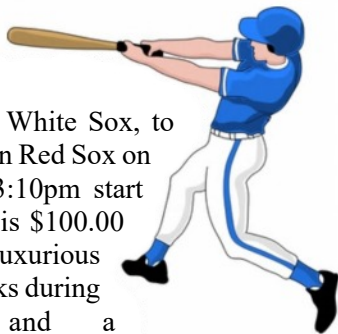
- Some really good news – A NCIRTL reception was held at the Silveus home on Thursday, March 23 with a pro life speaker. The proceeds for the evening was \$25000. As is the policy for these receptions, this amount will be split between NCITL and RTL OF INDIANA.

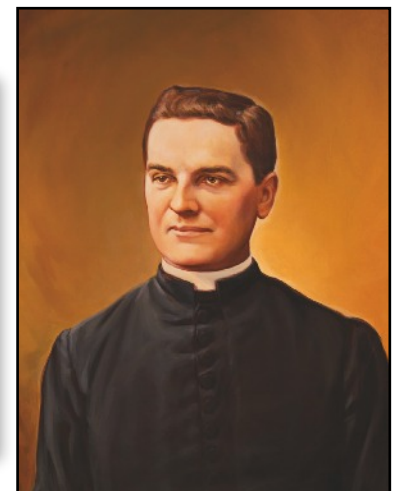
in your love so that we may continue his work of caring for the needy and the outcast.
