## Insurance

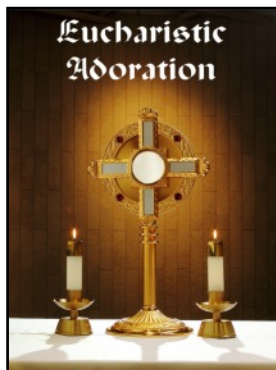

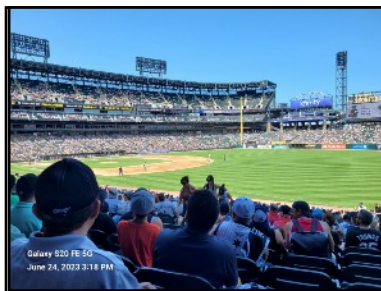

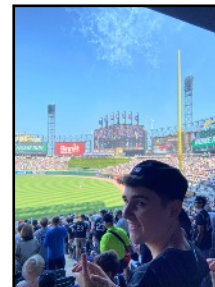
## Knights in Action

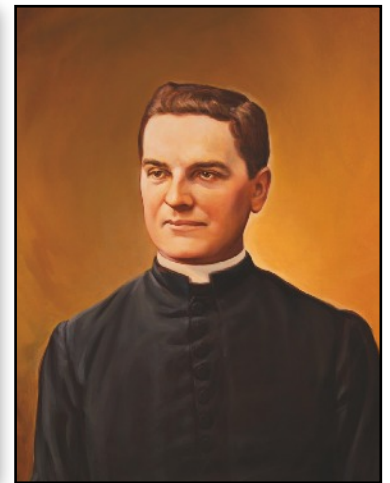
in your love so that we may continue his work of caring for the needy and the outcast.
