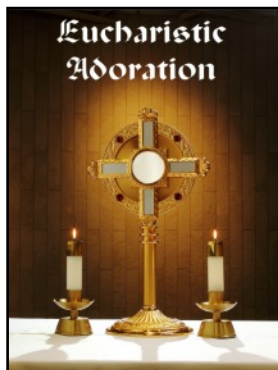

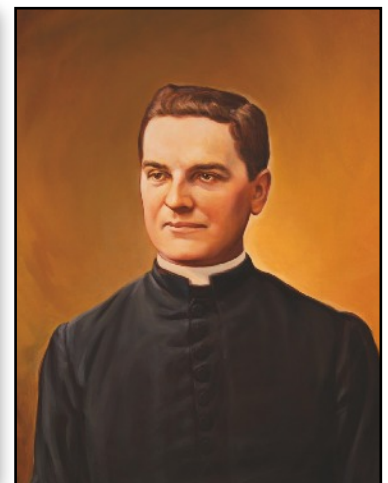
in your love so that we may continue his work of caring for the needy and the outcast.

Pro Life continued

During July NCIRTL hosted an information table at both the Kos. Co. fair and the Whitley Co. fair. As I was

manning the table in Warsaw, two boys of approximately 10 or 11 years of age approached the table and began to ask questions as they surveyed the display of the unborn baby models that range from 10 weeks to 26 weeks of gestation. The boys had come up to the commercial tents from the 4 H pig barn. They appeared full of energy and wore full faced grins on their faces. After holding some of the models for a while and conversing about what they saw, one of the boys ask, "How are they made?" Not sure just what he was asking, I finally figured out that he was asking about real life babies. My reply was that it takes one man and one woman who come together in marriage and they (at this point I had my hands on his shoulders and was shaking him vigorously) stay together for the rest of their lives. That satisfied him but I added that since his friend had brought pigs to the fair, he might gather more information about this matter from him. While this interchange was in progress I could not help seeing the mental image of Jesus saying to his disciples, "Let the little children come to Me" for the innocence registered on the faces of these boys was truly remarkable.

The Logansport, IN. newspaper had a recent article about a baby girl who was surrendered at the Kokomo baby box. The authorities learned that the baby was only 2 days old. This makes the fifth baby surrendered in the 7 counties united under NCIRTL and the 33rd infant since Safe Haven 's inception in 2017. God's work is so evident "for those who have eyes to see".

There is a saying 'enough is enough' and so a professional team of lawyers (4 in number) with vast experience trying thousands of cases has been assembled to confront the bigotry of the DOG toward Christian prayer volunteers. It is called the Institute of Law and Justice and seems to have some connection with 40 Days For Life. In New York, the Westchester County passed a "buffer zone" law to bar prolife Americans within up to 100 feet of an abortion facility. This entity filed a lawsuit, which they expect to win at the Supreme Court, and END all buffer zones across the entire nation.

The field of white crosses has done its work just north of Columbia City and will be taken down of Saturday, July 29. In the near future these crosses will again be erected at the Top of the Hill church just south of Warsaw on State Rd. 15. – *Bill*
