At the 2023 Convention of the Supreme Council last month in Orlando Florida, Patrick E. Kelly, Supreme Knight, directed us to focus on GROWTH during this fraternal year: Growth of Programs, Growth of Fraternal Benefits, Growth of Membership, Growth of Council Leadership, and, most importantly, Growth within the Domestic Church. Remember, for every five hundred dollars (\$500) the Council donates, our

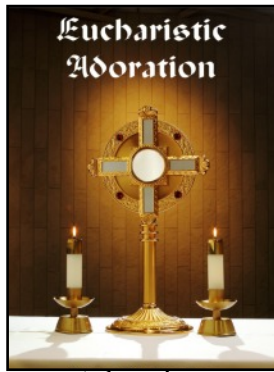

## Pro Life News

**PRO LIFE: THE CHEMICAL ABORTION DRUG, MIFEPREX (MIFEPRISTONE) HAS BEEN PLACED UNDER RESTRICTIONS DUE TO A RULING BY THE 5TH CIRCUIT COURT. THE COURT ARGUED THAT THE FDA ACTED UNLAWFULLY WHEN IT REDUCED REGULATIONS IN 1916 AND ILN 2021 RELATED TO THIS DRUG. IT ALSO SAID THE FDA HAD GIVEN INSUFFICIENT CONSIDERATION TO RECOGNIZED SAFETY ISSUES WITH THE DRUG. PROLIFE ADVOCATES KNEW THAT THE FDA HAD SURRENDERED TO THE PRO-DEATH CONTINGENT IN THIS MATTER. THE DRUG IS STILL AVAILABLE, BUT NOT VIA THE MAIL. ITS AVAILABILITY IS UNDER THE 2011 FDA APPROVED LABELING.**

Indiana's new abortion law is now in effect after it's certification by the Indiana Supreme Court. We need to be truly thankful to God and in turn, our Attorney General, Todd Rokita, for seeing through the challenge of the pro death advocates. This law is considered one of the strongest life measures among the various states. Hopefully, you saw the large article in the Times Union related to this law.

An all out support for and during the upcoming Annual NCIRTL Banquet is much needed. This can be done by assisting in the set up for the banquet and by attending the banquet on September the 18th. **Donut Dash** – This event that raises money for Heartline Pregnancy Center is headed full speed towards the date of October 4, 2023. It is held at the Health Services Center Pavilion, 1515 Provident Drive, Warsaw. Five or more Knights also help guide the participants around the race course.
