Chaplain's Report

The Doctors of the Church and Care of the Poor

The title "Doctor of the Church" is given to the saints most notable for the brilliance of their teaching. They were generally academics, professors, and preachers. Yet they did not regard this as sufficient. One remarkable thing they teach us is the importance of being personally involved in works of charity. St. John of Avila was known as the greatest preacher in all of Spain – yet he would take his friends with him late at night to go quietly visit the poor and sick. St. John Henry Newman was the most brilliant man of his entire generation, yet spent great quantities of

time visiting poor Irish factory workers and coordinating works of charity for the poor rural folk. St. Thomas Aquinas, commenting on Jesus' washing of the feet, summarizes this instinct common to them all: "I reply, according to Augustine, that every one should wash the feet of others, either in a physical or spiritual way. And it is much better, and true beyond argument, that one should do this in a physical way, so that a Christian will not consider it beneath him to do what Christ did." (St. Thomas Aquinas, Commentary on John, 1779)

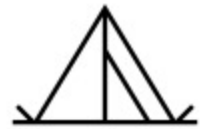
