Pro Life News

It is time to recall the efforts and activities that RTL (NCIRTL) has accomplished over the years. It began in 1973, the year that abortion was made lawful in the U. S. by six or more courageous women, the majority of which were Catholic. While these women persevered and did what they could at the time, the organization received a real boost when Dave Koontz, who was working full time as a financial management consultant, joined RTL. Dave brought his expertise and dynamic energy to the program and things began to pick up from that point. It was shortly after this that I joined the program and was elected president. This was around 1998. It was at that time that the first banquet was held and things took off from that point. What follows is a list of the accomplishment that RTL has compiled to date in no particular order.

. Four Spring Banquets – Columbia City, Marion, Plymouth and Wabash. This is a testament to some wonderful volunteers and staff members that has and will impact nearly 600 people. (Warsaw's banquet is in the fall.)

. Supporting five pregnancy centers by partnering with them financially in the nine counties that NCIRTL serves. This is somewhat unique! Most affiliate do not partner with a nearby pregnancy center. NCIRTL sees the pregnancy centers as the place where the “rubber meets the road.” The two are tied together as two ends of a pretzel.

. Pregnancy Center Networking Day – This program had almost 80 pregnancy center staff attend from 16 centers this year. The number attending has grown each year. Participants are coming from all over Indiana.

. Supporting Heartline Preg. Center – Dave Koontz severed as the Director for the past seven years along with being the Director of NCIRTL.

. The Mobile Ultrasound Program. Right to Life was directly involved in raising \$150,000 that supported this program while it was in place.

. Next Generation Impact – Partnering with Lakeland Christian and Grace College with the effort of supporting and sending more and more young people to the National March for Life in Wash. D.C.

. Life Guardians Training – A yearly hosting of young people who have the opportunity to here and communicate with well known and knowledgeable leaders in the pro life movement. Educating future leaders.

. Speaking to Youth Groups and Starting ‘New Students 4 Life’ Groups. This is just taking off as a talented student from Grace College has joined the staff. She has brought a new dynamic to the overall program that is helping to reach the



younger generation.

. Safe Haven Boxes – NCIRTL has been a part of raising \$70,000 to purchase and install six of the eight baby boxes in North Central Indiana and also spent \$100,000 on billboards advertising the hotline number.

. Billboards – Totally support up to 23 billboards at any one time in North Central Indiana that promote LIFE.

. Nine Counties are being served by NCIRTL. No other affiliate serves that number of counties.

. Office Building – Very few affiliates own their own building.

. Finances – Due to the many activities that aid the development of the program and the generosity of many pro life minded people, NCIRTL is a very good position financially.



. White Crosses – The communities of Rochester, Marian, Milford, Columbia City, Fort Wayne, Elkhart, Manchester, Kendallville and Warsaw have been blessed with this sight which is a sermon without words.

. County Fair Pro Life Displays – At least three of nine counties served have a table and other displays of pro life literature and related items during which they can interact with the fair goers.

. January Ad – Signatures of pro life minded people are collected each year and are listed in a full newspaper ad near the date in January when abortion was legalized in the U. S.

The success of this program is the result of the work of a passionate and dynamic leader and many sincere, humble and God fearing board members and volunteers who have seen themselves as God's feet and hands in this battle against evil.

2024 Tootsie Roll Drive Knights Bulletin

Save the Dates! May 3rd and 4th the Knights of Columbus annual community Tootsie Roll Drive will be held. The key to success centers on People Power! The Lord provides everything needed to aid those with intellectual disabilities served by Cardinal Services, Special Olympics, and Magical Meadows except for your YES to volunteer and help.

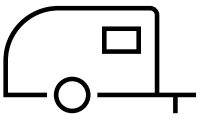
In 2023, 56 volunteers shared their time and talent to work 304 man hours on Tootsie Roll weekend. 42 of those volunteers were from Knights of Columbus and Sacred Heart Parish members. 10,800 Tootsie rolls were distributed and \$17,446 was raised despite weather interruptions.

The Knights Tootsie Roll project has been going strong for 48 years. Warsaw's Tootsie Roll records go back to 1986; since that time the Warsaw council has raised \$598,321. We need your help to keep this tradition going.

The Lord will again place the cars and shoppers on the streets and at the stores on May 3rd and 4th.
