Chaplain's Report

Handing on Catholicism

Our faith is, by its nature, traditional. St. Paul tells the Corinthians: "for I delivered to you as of first importance what I also received". We possess nothing that was not first handed on to us. But tradition is not a mere conservation of the past, it is a handing on of something living, growing, and active. Tradition thus, necessarily, involves new things. St. Paul himself, in handing on the gospel he had received, found it necessary to write the majority of the New Testament.

With that in mind, I want to share some examples of that living and active handing on of our tradition in the Catholic Church today in America.

We are blessed with a number of excellent publishers, putting out great Catholic books. I highly recommend the Ignatius Catholic Study Bible, by Ignatius Press. The Word on Fire Bible, from Word on Fire Press, is also excellent. They are also hard at work translating the complete works of Joseph Ratzinger/Pope Benedict XVI into English. A plethora of wonderful children's books are made available by Magnificat. The works of the great saints Augustine and Aquinas are now accessible in English thanks to the work of New City Press and the St. Paul Center, respectively.

The Gospel is not merely a written book, it is a living word that is preached. Here, too, we are greatly blessed by the preaching of Bishop Barron, Fr. Mike Schmitz, lay evangelists such as Chris Stefanick, and events such as the SEEK conference, and the National Eucharistic Congress.

New and beautiful Churches are sprouting up across our country. Locally, I encourage you to make a pilgrimage to St. Pius X in Granger IN, or to the Oratory of St. Mary Magdalene in Fort Wayne. Further afield, there is a gorgeous shrine to Bl. Stanley Rother, the first American-born martyr, in Oklahoma City. The Catholic Centers at Texas A+M, the University of Nebraska Lincoln, the University of Virginia, and the University of Wisconsin, in their beauty and fidelity to the truth of our faith, are wonderful signs of contradiction amongst the ugliness and godlessness of our secular universities. Even new monasteries are springing up out of the earth, to house men and women seeking Christ through poverty, chastity, and obedience. Cloistered Dominicans in Linden, VA, Premonstratensians at St. Michael's abbey in

CA, Benedictines at Clear Creek in OK, and many others throughout the country.

Beautiful new music is being composed for the glory of God and the adornment of the Mass. Archbishop Salvatore Cordileone of San Francisco has commissioned a plethora of new mass settings, hymns, and other choral works. Here at our own parish, we are benefiting from the Source & Summit missal, making available not only beautiful old hymns and chants, but also new pieces of music, such as the Mass of St. Philip Neri, by the composer Paul Jernberg. The Ecce young adult choir out of Fort Wayne and Toledo provides wonderful opportunities to experience this music.

Likewise, artists and artisans are also hard at work. I encourage everyone to visit St. Charles in Fort Wayne to view the work of award-winning sacred artist Gwyneth Thompson-Briggs. Online, many artists have made their works available for purchase. Please consider acquiring a piece from Daniel Mitsui, Bernadette Carstensen, and Matthew Conner (look them up online). Here at Sacred Heart, we are blessed to have a beautiful new labor to place our monstration upon, thanks to the artisans at the Spanish firm Molina. Our beautiful vestments come from House of Hansen in Chicago, cloistered Dominicans in New Jersey, and artisans in England and Rome.

Many of us are finding fraternity and spiritual growth through new spiritual societies, such as Exodus 90 and Magnify 90. Likewise, I encourage you to look into the apostolates of Communion & Liberation, Opus Dei, and the third orders of various religious communities. Other lay efforts include faithful Catholic centers of education – universities such as Thomas Aquinas College in CA, the University of Mary in ND, and the Franciscan University of Steubenville. Dioceses such as Denver and Marquette have provided curriculum to promote Catholic identity across every subject in their schools. There are active associations of Catholic doctors, lawyers, and business professionals, seeking to infuse their professional lives with the light of their faith.

Let's tune out from the senseless online controversies, give thanks to God for all He has done for our Church in this country, take encouragement from all that is flowering in our Church in this country, and work to pass on the faith we have received in our families, in our parish, and in our community.

Pro Life News

Pro Life - Remember David Daleiden who in 2015 released a series of condemning videos exposing Planned Parenthood of harvesting and selling baby parts acquired from their abortion facilities. Using a proabortion judge in California, a gag order was placed on David and his videos. In addition he was threatened with million of dollars in fines and a long jail sentence. This effectively "shut David's mouth". However, a congressional investigation occurred during the last national Congress and although the President and his allies tried very hard to intervene, there was enough heat put on Planned Parenthood that it did not pursue more action against David. Meanwhile, David and his Center of Medical Progress continued to investigate the practices of PPOfA. CMP has discovered new evidence that PPOfA actions concerning innocent unborn life amount to murder for hire. They recently received records from the University of California San Deigo through the state open records law that reveal PPOfA sells VIABLE healthy aborted babies that can survive outside their mother's womb to the U of California SD.

The U of California SD then uses these aborted babies for gruesome fetal research experiments. What was uncovered was a never-before -seen contract showing PPOfA supplying what it calls its "proprietary" aborted fetal body parts to U of California San Deigo. PP supplied aborted baby body parts such as hearts, eyes, livers and brains for 15 years in return for this "valuable consideration". Valuable consideration refers to the "intellectual property" and "patent rights" in the aborted body parts that are potentially worth millions of dollars. This is a FEDERAL FELONY.

The investigation has uncovered a new dimension to the collaboration with UCSD. One heavily redacted research proposal says: "We will collect tissues from fetuses ranging 4 to 23 weeks gestational age from subjects undergoing elective surgical pregnancy termination at PP in San Deigo." The fetuses being harvested in the 6-month of pregnancy are described as

being "viable nonanomalous", meaning that this 6-month old baby is healthy and can survive outside the mother's womb. The research proposal even stipulates that they will document "evidence of fetal heart activity by ultrasound" right before the abortion is performed". How many babies were to be harvested and provided to UCSD? Answer 2500. How were these babies to be harvested? Emails confirm that PP and UCSD intends to harvest the fetuses by giving women the chemical abortion drug Misoprostol several hours before the abortion and thus it is not likely to be a standard forceps abortion. The result is therefore either intact partial-birth abortion or whole delivery of live preemie. Can this be labeled anything but "murder for hire"?

David Daleiden and the CMP are promising that their investigation will result in congressional action in the new Congress. Planned Parenthood is already under federal investigation. It is expected that these new revelations will re-ignite public scrutiny regarding Planned Parenthood.

San Deigo, California is noted for another abortion related situation. A new "buffer zone" law is a direct assault on free speech. The law mandates that pro-lifers maintain an eight-foot distance from anyone within a 100-foot radius of abortion clinics, schools, and churches. This effectively silences their voices. The law grants police sweeping authority to disperse pro-lifers on demand. Private citizens can sue pro-life volunteers, thus weaponizing the legal system against peaceful pro-lifers. This violates the First Amendment. A pro-life legal group, Life Legal, is taking the city to court to stop this action.

As always, there is a great need for prayer in general as well as for those who are on the front row in the court room defending life.
