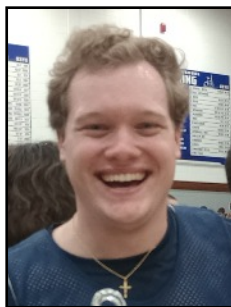

Chaplain's Report

Happy Easter! First of all, a hearty thank you on behalf of all of the new Catholics for the beautiful bibles you gifted them. I am happy to report that I continue to see our new Catholics engaging in their faith, even bringing friends and family to Mass with them, and seeking additional ways to involve themselves in the parish – even including joining the Knights of Columbus.

I have often wondered how it was that so many people came to join our Church this past Easter, and I have two simple answers. The first is that every conversion is a gift from the Holy Spirit that we have done nothing to merit. The second is that our parish is a healthy place that is attractive to people wishing to convert. Our parishioners love being Catholic, care deeply about each other, and are willing to put in the hard work to make everything happen.

I urge us to the same in our Council. Ultimately, the chief recruiting officer for the KofC is the Holy Spirit. Second, the best way to attract new members to our council is to be a healthy council filled with members whose conduct is attractive to people who are looking to get more involved in their faith. That means loving being a Knight – from the monthly meetings, to the charitable activities, to the uniform. That means caring deeply about each other – I encourage you to make sure every time we meet that our conversation

rises above the trite and mundane to speak of things of truer consequence – and most especially, to talk to each other of God and the things of God. That means putting in the hard work – the prep work and clean up, recruitment of volunteers, so many other sundry items you know far better than I.

Towards that end, I would encourage us to embrace the following virtues. First, Hospitality – our parish has a reputation for it already, but it is up to each of us to keep it alive. Smile! Welcome people! Ask their names! Don't let it remain shallow – engage them in an authentically human interaction. Second, Humility – be willing to do the grunt work. Don't look for undue recognition. Work well with others. Third, Faith – be an example to your family, to your friends, to your coworkers of your Catholic Faith. Be willing even to take on a challenge for Christ and His Church!

I see all of these things in so many ways already amongst you all, and I pray that with the grace of Christ's Resurrection they may shine even more resplendently in our Council, our Parish, our Diocese, and the entire Church.

Pro Life News

We are now at a pivotal moment in our ongoing fight for the sanctity of each human life, from beginning to end. The abortionists have been dealt two staggering blows.

First, when Roe v Wade was overturned in 2022, abortion's privileged status as a purported federal constitutional right for a half-century ended. Article after article championing abortion's point of view are full of half-truths to being pure fabrication. We cannot relax. Instead, we must fight on, undeterred, with God's truth as our armament and hope as our banner! 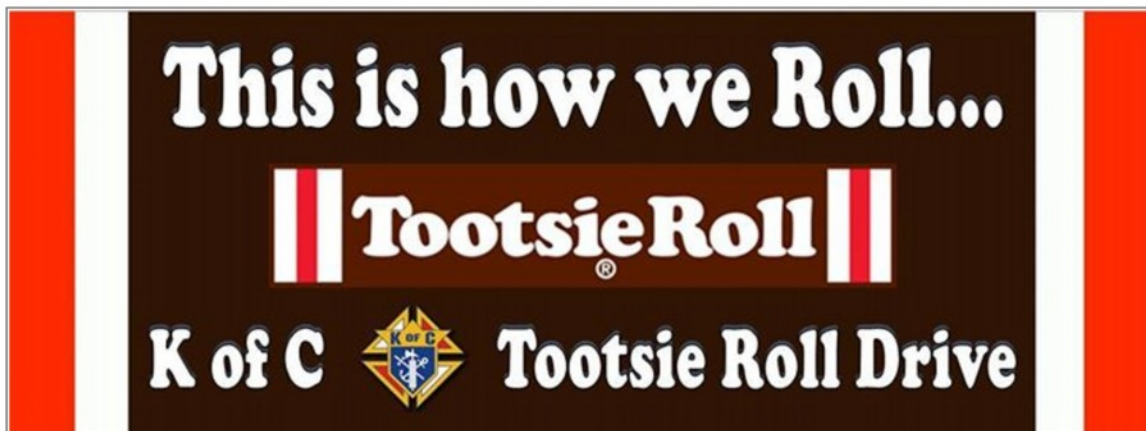

Don't underestimate what the Lord can do with a just a little gift of your time given for the intellectually disabled. Come out and help when you get the call and see what He can do.



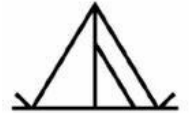


CALLING ALL CAMPERS! SAVE THE DATE:
