



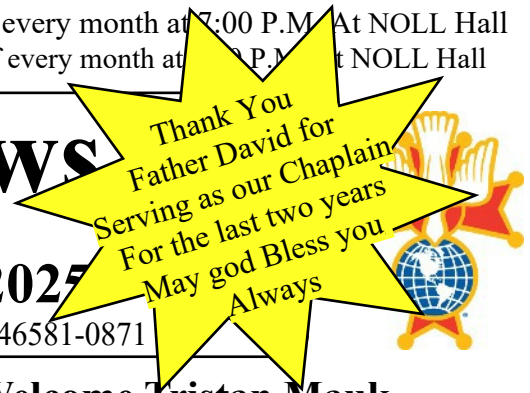

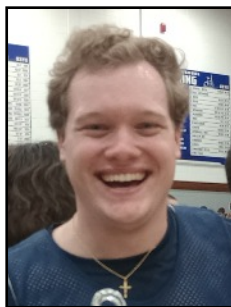

Pro Life News

Defunding Planned Parenthood -

The House of Representatives has passed Trump's Big Beautiful Bill and within it is a cut off of Medicaid funding to the abortion businesses including Planned Parenthood. The bill now goes to the Senate where the bill needs a simple majority vote to approve it. This is not a sure thing as there are a least 3 senators who are very concerned about the next round of elections. If it comes to a tie vote, Vice President Vance would break the tie. Pray, Pray, Pray that the bill is passed in the Senate. It would be wise to contact our Senators with the following: "I do not want my tax dollars funding the abortion industry. Please do all that you can to encouraged the passage of Trump's Big Beautiful Bill."

The Indiana legislature passed milestone legislation requiring all state accredited schools to provide medically accurate and age-appropriate education of human growth and development during pregnancy. It requires that the education include (A)high definition ultrasound video, at

least three (3) minutes of duration, showing the development of the brain, heart, sex organs, and other vital organs in early fetal development, (B) A high quality computer generated rendering or animation showing the process of fertilization and each stage of fetal development inside the uterus, noting significant markers in cell growth and organ development for every week of pregnancy from fertilization to birth. This law is SEA 442.

ADOPTION - A bill which supports zero cost for adoption is headed to Missouri Governor Mike Kehoe's desk. Hopefully, Indiana will follow suit and bring zero adoption cost to our state. Being pro life means much more than protecting the unborn - it means supporting children and families after birth as well. Thanks to Governor Braun, Indiana took a decisive pro family step by expanding parental leave for state employees . His executive order extended paid childcare recovery leave to six weeks and up to 150 hours of paid leave after the birth or adoption of a child.

in your love so that we may continue his work of caring for the needy and the outcast.

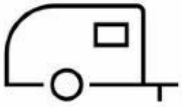

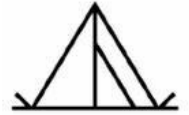


CALLING ALL CAMPERS! SAVE THE DATE:
