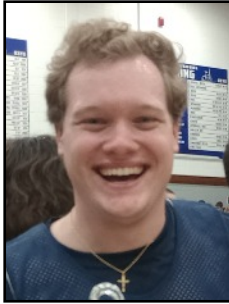

in your love so that we may continue his work of caring for the needy and the outcast.

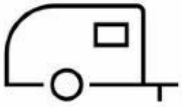

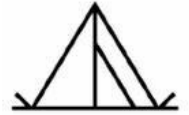


CALLING ALL CAMPERS! SAVE THE DATE:
